This is an amazing opportunity for your students, friends and colleagues to experience another aspect of Chinese culture and society with sizhu music (Chinese chamber music). Chai Found was founded by world class performers to restore sizhu and find new ways to innovate on traditional motifs to bring chinese chamber music into the new millenium. Using the six most representative instruments of this Chinese musical tradition: the erhu, the di, the pipa, the guzheng, the yangqin, and the ruanxian, Chai Found grounds itself in, yet transcends, the limits of their genre. The unique characteristics of sizhu music have attracted numbers of Western composers to write new pieces for the ensemble. The Chai Found Music Workshop is dedicated to promoting Chinese culture and will be bringing their revival of sizhu to Long Island in an unforgettable performance to celebrate the Chinese New Year.
