Save the Date - Sunday, March 30, 2008

As parents and parents-to-be, we have all wondered about our children's birthparents - who are they? What circumstances made them, or will make them, decide to give their children away? How do children end up in orphanages and what are their lives like their? What does the average Chinese person feel about Americans and international adoption?

To answer these questions, Dr. Changfu Chang worked on the documentary "Long Wait for Home" for five years. For the first time, we sit face-to-face with birthparents who share with us the difficult decisions they have made and the emotional toll it has taken on them. Dr. Chang takes us into orphanages to look at the living conditions that are usually inaccessible to film crews and converses with everyday Chinese on the subject of international adoption.

Dr. Chang has graciously accepted to share, as he calls it, "his works of love" with us. On Sunday, March 30, 2008, Dr. Chang will present his films "Long Wait for Home" and "Peer in the Distance" with FCC-LI families. This event will take place at Suffolk Community College - the exact location and time (*probably 2:30*) will be announced early next week.
