*TAALI Cultural Summer Day-Camp is making its debut starting on August 25 (Monday) for a week in Centereach High School. The fee is \$200 for 5 days. The day-camp runs from 9 AM to 4 PM during the week of August 25 while campers can be dropped off after 8:30 am and be picked up before 5:30 pm. Four cultural classes are prepared for each camper and they are Chinese Arts and Crafts, Folk Dance, Acrobatics, and Singing. Three classes are divided/separated according to all campers' ages (See Page 2 of the Summer Day-Camp registration form in PDF file for more info). Again, I have attached the flyer (page 1) and the registration form (Pages 3 and 4) in the third PDF file. Please feel free to distribute/forward to your FCCLI members who may be interested in having their children participate in this very cultural camp. By the way, our cultural classes' teachers are from Taiwan and teach in English, and there will be teacher's assistants available on-site throughout the camp time. The registration deadline is July 31, and it may be extended for one more week until August 7.*

*Last, but not the least, TAALI has held, for three years in a row, one major cultural event in May in celebrating Taiwanese American Heritage Week/Month. Each May, a group of 12 to 24 performers, ranging from professional percussionists to acrobatic dancers, come directly from Taiwan and deliver their artistic performance to entertain and educate people who enjoy Chinese culture.*

*I believe that if more of us can work together, we can make more of our next generation learn more about Chinese, its language and culture, by getting our children involved and by having parents included. This belief is one of the missions TAALI strives for --- To educate young Taiwanese Americans and general public about Taiwanese heritage and culture through workshops, seminars, and large cultural events.
